

Sung Eucharist for Advent



Advent is a season of expectation and preparation, for both the coming (latin Adventus) of Christ in his birth at Christmas, and as judge at the end of time. The readings and prayers point to Christ's birth, and challenge us with the theme of divine judgement. Preparation, like that in Lent before Easter, along with alert watchfulness are the moods of the season, although the anticipated joy and celebration of the coming Christmas can leak into Advent.

In all the busy-ness and the commercial pressures that Christmas can bring, keeping Advent well gives us the opportunity to enter a more serene time of reflection as we ensure our spiritual preparations are at least as thorough as our shopping and decorating. In the darkness of this season, we await the coming of the light.

The Gathering

Stand for the Opening Hymn - see board or leaflet for the number.

During the hymn the choir moves to the Chancel Steps and gathers around the Advent Wreath.

The Greeting

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. The Lord be with you and also with you.

The Advent Wreath Ceremony

Children may go to the church hall for Sunday Club and choristers process to the stalls.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayers of Penitence

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light things now hidden in darkness, and will disclose the purposes of the heart. Therefore in the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

Please sit or kneel for the Confession

Most merciful God,
Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
We confess that we have sinned
In thought, word and deed.
We have not loved you with our whole heart.

We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. In your mercy
Forgive what we have been,

And walk humbly with you, our God.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you And also with you.

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God It is right to give thanks and praise.

(from the First Sunday of Advent until 16 December)

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son.

For when he humbled himself to come among us in human flesh, he fulfilled the plan you formed before the foundation of the world to open for us the way of salvation.

Confident that your promise will be fulfilled, we now watch for the day when Christ our Lord will come again in glory.

And so we join our voices with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven to proclaim your glory, for ever praising you and singing:

(from 17 December until Christmas Eve)

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son.

He is the one foretold by all the prophets, whom the Virgin Mother bore with love beyond all telling. John the Baptist was his herald and made him known when at last he came.

In his love Christ fills us with joy as we prepare to celebrate his birth,

so that when he comes again he may find us watching in prayer, our hearts filled with wonder and praise.

And so, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your glory, and join in their unending hymn of praise:

Choir: Holy, holy, holy Lord,

God of power and might,

Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Sit or kneel

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.

Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus:

Amen.

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life: Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with [N and] all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us

Give us this day our daily bread.

Giving of Communion

Draw near with faith, receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you and his blood which he shed for you. Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

Communicant members of all Christian denominations are welcome to receive. Alternatively you are welcome to come forward for a blessing — bring this service booklet to indicate that a blessing is requested. The steps to the left and right of the altar have a hand rail. Follow the Wardens' directions to go forward.

An Anthem may be sung by the choir. See hymn board or leaflet for Communion Hymn number.

The post Communion Prayer is said, then the following:
